Guidance

1. Criminal Defence Service (Funding) Order 2007, as amended by the Criminal Defence Service (Funding) (Amendment) Order 2007, Paragraph 1 of Schedule 1 defines "pages of prosecution evidence" as:

1 (2) The number of pages of prosecution evidence served on the court includes – all witness statements, documentary and pictorial exhibits, records of interviews with the assisted person, and records of interviews with other defendants, which form part of the committal or served prosecution documents or which are included in any notice of additional evidence, but does not include any document provided on CD-ROM or by other means of electronic communication.

1 (3) In proceedings on indictment in the Crown Court initiated otherwise than by committal for trial, the appropriate officer must determine the number of pages of prosecution evidence in accordance with sub-paragraph (2) or as nearly in accordance with it as possible as the nature of the case permits.

2. Precis of The Graduated Fee Guidance Manual <http://www.hmcourts-service.gov.uk/cms/781.htm>:

Count. • Transcripts of video evidence asked for by the judge. • When a transcript has been expanded by the prosecution or the defence, because the one provided by the prosecution was deemed insufficient to go before the jury, count the fullest transcript produced and the version in the committal bundle. • Any page that is allowable is counted as one page regardless of the number of lines, making no allowance for small or large font.

Do Not Count • Documents provided outside the committal bundle or without written notice of additional evidence.

• Title pages or separator pages. • Versions of a transcript edited for the purpose of being put before the jury.
