

Procurement Plan for Camden

Procurement Summary

1. Family Services

We intend to invite bids for **870** New Matter Starts (NMS) for the provision of face-to-face Family advice within the procurement area (PA) of Camden.

There is currently access to Family advice across the procurement area and although our current spend is lower than suggested by our indicative spend budget model, the market is well developed and we anticipate that there may be competition in this area.

Significant demand for public law services is evident in this PA and figures from the Inner London Family Proceedings Court show an increase in local authority care proceedings in this PA between 07/08 and 08/09. We consider that these clients may require advice across a wide range of family issues and we will therefore advertise the tender as **Service Specification A**.

- Providers will be required to deliver the full range of private family work **and** public law children work.
- Providers will need to have a permanent presence in the PA.
- Providers will be required to tender for and undertake a minimum of **75** Legal Help cases per year and **5** public law certificated cases per year.

Providers who wish to undertake only work for children will be able to tender for a specialist children contract with no requirement to undertake the full range of family services.

2. Family & Housing (Combined Service)

We will set aside a small proportion of the available NMS in Housing for providers wishing to deliver a combined Housing and Family service.

We have seen a significant amount of demand for this service within the procurement area. We will therefore make **800** NMS in Housing available for providers wishing to deliver a combined Housing and Family service.

Providers wishing to bid for this service combination will be required to tender for and undertake a minimum of **50** NMS in Housing per schedule year.

3. Social Welfare Law Services

We intend to place tenders for **2,880** NMS across the core Social Welfare Law (SWL) categories of Housing, Debt and Welfare Benefits advice, **100** in Community Care and **250** in Employment.

We currently have high levels of access in SWL across the PA and we expect that there will be competition to deliver services in the area. To ensure continued good client access to services we will invite bids under **Service Specification A**.

Housing, Debt and Welfare Benefits will be advertised together as a bundle of services and providers will be required to bid for and provide services in all three categories.

- Providers may bid to deliver Housing, Debt and Welfare Benefits either as a single legal entity or as part of a consortium.
- Providers delivering Housing, Debt and Welfare Benefits will need to have a permanent presence in the PA.
- Providers delivering Housing, Debt and Welfare Benefits will be required to undertake a minimum of **100** NMS in each category per schedule year.
- Providers delivering Community Care will be required to undertake a minimum of **20** NMS per schedule year.
- Providers delivering Employment will be required to undertake a minimum of **30** NMS per schedule year.
- Community Care and Employment providers will be required to have a part-time presence in the PA.
- As tenders are invited under **Service Specification A**, we will require providers to employ an authorised litigator in order to conduct Housing and / or Community Care services.

For Debt, Housing and Welfare Benefits, we will divide the available NMS for the PA between the three categories as follows:

4. Access

There are no potential access issues within Camden as the area is geographically small and good public transport links are available across the whole of the PA. Therefore no criteria will be used to select providers on the basis of their location within the area and providers will only be required to have a permanent presence within the PA.

5. Budget

Current spend in this area is lower than that which we would expect to spend in Family Legal Help according to the Indicative Spend Budget Model. Therefore, the total number of NMS available in this area will be increased to enable an increase in access to services which moves closer to that suggested by the Model.

Current spend in this area is higher than that which we would expect to spend in SWL services according to the Indicative Spend Budget Model. It is therefore unlikely that we would wish to actively increase the provision of SWL services and matter starts will be carefully managed with the aim of remaining within the level of current spend.
