

**NOTICE OF EXTENSION TO THE UNIFIED CONTRACT (CIVIL) 2007
IN RESPECT OF FAMILY AND HOUSING CATEGORIES OF LAW
EXTENSION OF THE CONTRACT TO 31 JANUARY 2012**

Words and expressions defined in the Unified Contract (Civil) 2007 have the same meanings when used in this notice.

This notice of extension will only affect the Suppliers specified below who provide services in the Family and Housing Categories of Law under the Unified Contract (Civil) 2007.

The extension only applies to those Suppliers who:

- (i) previously provided services in the Housing Category of Law under the Unified Contract (Civil) 2007 (i.e. had an allocation of new matter starts in Housing);
- (ii) also provided services in the Family Category of Law under that Contract; and
- (iii) have not been successful in obtaining a 2010 Standard Civil Contract covering Housing in the tenders for Social Welfare Law services.

Pursuant to Clause 2 of the Contract for Signature (Contract Extension), the term of the Unified Contract (Civil) 2007 is extended for those affected so that it expires at midnight on 31 January 2012.

To give effect to the extension of the Unified Contract (Civil) 2007, Clause 1 of the Contract for Signature (Contract Period) has been amended for those Suppliers as follows to reflect the new date on which this Contract will expire:

“Contract Period

1. *This Contract will start on 1 April 2007. It will expire at midnight on 31 January 2012 unless it is lawfully ended or extended before then.”*

The extension authorises work in both the Family and Housing Categories. Unless we specify otherwise in your Schedule, the extension does not authorise Tolerance work or Licensed work in Categories other than Family and Housing.

Note that Suppliers who are not affected by this notice but who currently provide Family services under the Unified Contract (Civil) 2007 should refer to the separate notice of amendment and extension we have issued which relates to the Family Category of Law only.

This notice will be deemed received in accordance with Clause 24 of the Unified Contract (Civil) 2007 Standard Terms.
